(1) In a career that spanned nearly thirty years, flew every carrier-based model aircraft; as a "must-pump" pilot replacing combat losses, saw the end of hostilities in the Vietnam War. From there served three tours in CVW-5/ USS *Midway* (CV41) experiencing the fast-paced and challenging ops of a forward-deployed, 7th Fleet carrier. As Commander, CVW 14, saw USS *Midway* back home to San Diego for her decommissioning. Proudest moment was flying a blue jet over my hometown of San Francisco during Fleet Week.

(1) Blessed to be married to my wife of 55 years, Carol Doyle Moneymaker, a true Navy wife. We have five children and twelve grandchildren. Our son, Mathew lost his life during launch from the deck of USS *John F Kennedy* while operating in the Persian Gulf.

(2) My Father was a Pearl Harbor survivor who then went on to crew nine submarine patrols in the USS *Hake*, cruising the same waters as I did on USS *Midway* just thirty years later. You just can't make this stuff up.
