Summary of Significant Career Events

(1) Fortunate and appreciative to have served with many "Great American" mentors and outstanding sailors throughout my career.

(2) VFA-82 awarded the Battle "E" and LCDR Michael Estocin Award during squadron command. Deployed to Laage, Germany to fight and train with Former Soviet Union Mig-29s.

(3) VFA-106, the FA-18 FRS, awarded the Safety "S." Repeated deployment to fight Mig-29s enabling replacement pilots to fight Mig-29s for their first dissimilar training.

(4) Very proud of the success of officers who I have served with while in command:

a. VFA-106: Four junior officer instructors are now flag officers.

b. VFA-82: Seven aviators/officers achieved commander command. Two aviators achieved major command (one base/one current CVN CO)

c. CVW-1: 13 commanding/executive officers achieved major command (base, CAG, MAG, type wing). One commanding officer promoted to 3-star USMC general officer.

d. CSG-2: Five major commanders promoted to flag rank. Two are current 3-stars with one more awaiting confirmation.

(5) As a Naval Strike Warfare Center instructor, led the operational deployment of the Tactical Air Launch Decoy (TALD) to the fleet. Started Fleet Integrated Suppression Training (FIST) for airwing Fallon detachments. Key member of the Walleye reliability assessment program.

(6) Initial Strike Warfare Officer in CVW-1 and second in the Navy. After CAG (CAPT Mike Bowman) relieved CAG OPS, became the Airwing Operations Officer during Desert Shield and Desert Storm (as a pre-squadron department head). Flew multiple Desert Storm Sorties (interdiction, armed recce, defense suppression, kill box,...) and expended Walleyes on the Ramadi Bridge in Iraq with LCDR Rodger Welch.

(7) 5200+ mishap free hours. (includes one A-7 engine coming apart and one FA-18C M61 20mm machine gun exploding during a practice strafing run while deployed.)
