Summary of Significant Career Events

1. VX-5 member of the initial F/A-18 Aircrew Systems Advisory Panel (ASAP) early in the pre-production phase of development of the Hornet. Highlight was three evaluation flights in the YF-17 at Edwards Air Force Test Center.

2. Privileged to stand up VFA-25 as XO and then CO to pair with VFA-113 to make the first F/A-18 extended deployment to the Western Pacific and Indian Ocean.

3. Hand-picked by CinCPacFlt ADM Ace Lyons as his Special Assistant for Strike Warfare. In that position I reviewed every Air Wing's contingency strike plans prior to their entry to 7th Fleet waters.

Summary of Post Military Work

The Grumman Aerospace Corporation:

Hired on 15 November 1988 as an Experimental Test Pilot and Director of Flight Safety, based at the Calverton Naval Weapons Industrial Reserve Plant, Long Island NY. In that capacity I flew A-6E, EA-6B, F-14D and the Siai Marchetti S211 entry for the Joint Primary Aircraft Trainer System (JPATS).

Grumman began closing production lines at Bethpage and Calverton in 1993-1994. As a result I was transferred to the Grumman modification and overhaul facility in St Augustine as the Chief Pilot. As such, I continued to fly the A-6E, EA-6B, and was qualified as a co-pilot in the E-2C. I continued as Chief Pilot until 2000 when the new contracts did not fund corporate aircrews for post-maintenance/modification check flights. A facility reorganization made me the Integrated Product Team (IPT) Manager for all programs other than new production of the E-2C. This included the mod/overhaul of E-2C, F-14A+, EA-6B, the modification of an F-5E into a Shaped Sonic Boom Demonstrator (NASA/ Dryden), and components to enable F/A-18D to become EF-18Gs.

I retired from Northrop Grumman in June 2006.

Summary of Post Military Work

1. Co-authored with my father our family memoir titled In My Father's Footsteps; A Story of Father and Son Naval Aviators. Altogether it was a 6-year project on and off but was not published until after my father's passing.

2. Serve as a Board Member for the A-7 Corsair II Association, Inc and for the Fist of the Fleet Association.

3. Serve as Mentor Coordinator for the Veterans Treatment Court, St Johns and Putnam County, FL. We have been at it since January 2017.

4. Past President of the Vietnam Veterans Association Chapter 1084, St Johns County, FL

5. Volunteer with Mayo Clinic and Community Hospice visiting hospitalized Veterans.

6. Inducted into the Florida Veterans Hall of Fame, Class of 2022.
