

 - > Led the team that won the Light Attack Wing Atlantic weapons competition.
 - > Air Wing Top Ten Tailhook Award for both *America* and *Independence* deployments.

Summary of Significant Career Events continued

 - > Deployed in *Kennedy*.
 - > Around the world Deployment Carl Vinson.
 - First Centurion on CVN70.
 - Led and flew the redeployed of two A7Es from Cubi Point to CVN70 in the Gulf of Aden with VMGR 152 C130 tanking support across the Indian Ocean but without Air Force support.
 - Won the Air Wing 15 Top Tailhook Award for the deployment.
 - > First USN UDP Deployment to First Marine Air Wing/Marine Air Group 12, Iwakuni, Japan.
