

- (2) First Naval Aviator shot down twice, 05/21/66 & 07/04/66 over North Vietnam.
- (3) Called evasive turns for my wingman with Mig-17 shooting at him, 05/10/1972.
- (4) Presented Post Combat Performance of A7E to Ling Temco Vaught employees and Board of Directors.
- (5) One of four finalists for Blue Angel Lead.
- (6) As Air Boss, took the USS *Constellation* through major overhaul to accommodate the F-14.
- (7) Selected for Captain but decided to retire as Commander.
