

Ensign, USNR, ranked 3-of-35 and Regimental Adjutant w/ awards in Academic, Military and Physical Training.

- (2) Chose F-4B training out of Basic NAO School and Designated NAO-I # 308 Jan-65.
- (3) Joined VF-102 for USS America first Shake-Down/ ORE/ORI and first Deployment. Served as Airframes, Corrosion Control and Calendar Inspections Officer in Maintenance.
- (4) Promoted to LTJG Aug-65.
- (5) One of first few NAOs Navy-wide to be selected for "Retread" Pilot Training in 1966.
- (6) Class Leader at VT-1, Saufley; VT-9, Meridian; VT-4, Pensacola; and VT-21, Kingsville.
- (7) Received "High Flyer" Award 3-67, and Designated Naval Aviator # V-23480 Jul-67.
- (8) Completed F-4B/J Phantom II Replacement Pilot Training with VF-101, Feb-68.
- (9) Reported to VF-103 Feb-68. Served as Pers Officer, LSO, Quality Assurance and Ass't Maintenance.
- (10) Selected by CO to oversee all aspects of Squadron's new F-4Js and integration of ACLS, Mode-I aboard USS Saratoga; the first deployment of both. Identified unsatisfactory ACLS system commands, determined later to be cross-wiring of Ship's Navigation System output of Pitch and Roll data to ACLS.
- (11) Selected as Primary Project Officer for F-14A Tomcat/ Awg-9/AIM-54 OPEVAL, Jan-71. Team produced and delivered F-14A Secret Tactical Manual Supplement to CNO, (OP-05) 1 May-71. Designed and flew first six F-14A Initial Operational T&E flights, Sep-Oct-72.
- (12) Deep selected for Lieutenant Commander, 1972.
- (13) VX-4 Pilot Rep for Navy's Joint Evaluation Team, integrating Board of Inspection & Survey, Navy Preliminary Evaluation, and OPEVAL of F-14A. Fired first F-14A Operational AIM-54 Phoenix missile; multi-target/ Look down-shoot down w/ standoff noise jamming: Direct hit on QF-9J, and second target re-attacked w/AIM-9E Sidewinder/SEAM lock; also successful.
- (14) First F-14A pilot to design and fly tests -vs- MiG-17 and Mig-21s; Sep/Oct-73. Briefed CNO, (OP-05).
- (15) CAG-14 LSO aboard USS *Enterprise* for first Fleet CARQUAL and deployment of F-14A, Sep-74.

- (16) First F-14A shipboard Barricade engagement before Freznel lens data promulgated. Superb crew coordination and pilot skill resulted in minimal and insignificant damage to F-14A!

- (18) First XO of TOPGUN selected to CO; and last LCDR to Command NFWS; Mar-78. Completed Manpower study to increase future pilot, NFO and enlised Manning. USMC increased pilot and length of tour assignments. Testified before Senate Armed Services Committee and built a case for replacing three aged T-38 trainers with new F-5Fs. Moved NFWS to Hgr1 and modernized classrooms.
- (19) As CO, VF-213, sold Section Takeoff procedures to NATOPS Conference, Fall-80. Fabricated Riflescope installation and drafted tactics for Visual ID predicated on results of ACE/AIMVAL. Wrote RAMEC for installation of Photosonics KB-26A Gunsight camera and another for Voice recorder: both were approved. Squadron set Air-to-Air gunnery records for F-14A, Jun-80 that were never exceeded. Squadron won first COMFIT "Fighter Derby", Aug-80; after completing day/night Carrier Training.
- (20) Selected for Major Shore Command, Fall-86, and Reported as CO Naval Station, Rota, Spain, Jun-87 and Commander, U.S. Naval Activities, Spain.
