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Summary of Significant Career Events

(1) VMFA-334, 1967 -1969. F-4J(a) The first F-4J Squadron in the Marine Corps

(b) Included training with the Navy FRS VF-121.

(c) Flew 325 Combat Missions from both Danang and Chu Lai performing: Close/Direct Air Support Photo Escort. Night A-6 escort, BARCAP, Recon extract support.

(d) Was awarded 3 Distinguished Flying Crosses and 2 Single Mission Air Medals for heroic action during aerial flight.

(2) ALO/FAC Korean Marine Brigade, Oct-Dec 1968: ALO/ FAC KOREAN Marine Brigade: Ground Controlled air strikes for three months in the Hoian Valley.

(3) VMFAT-101 1969-1971: Initial cadre Instructor Pilot forming the first Marine Corps Phantom FRS.

(4) USAF Exchange Pilot, 48th Fighter Intercept Squadron, Air Defense Command(ADC)1971-1973

(a) Flew F-106 for two years, Assistant Operations Officer and Flight Commander of a 750 man F-106 Squadron with 26 aircraft.

(5) Naval Test Center/Navy Test Pilot School, 1979-1981:(a) Assigned to fly the F-18 Hornet, became the 25th Pilot to fly the F-18.

(b) First Marine to flight test and fire the M-61 20 mm cannon and drop bombs off the F-18.

(c) Conducted numerous flight tests on flight control software, radar/avionics integration and weapons seperation.

Summary of Post Military Work

(1) Experimental Test Pilot for McDonnell Douglas/Boeing(a) Worked FAA Certification Programs for the MD-87,MD-88 and MD -11.

(b) Transferred to the C-17 Program two years before "first flight" due to his experience with F/A "fly by wire" flight controls (same major vendor as the Hornet), Navy style angle of attack, and A-4 sick grip (used in the C-17).

(c) Became the third Boeing pilot to fly the C-17.

(d) Worked for four years (1991-1995) from Edwards AFB flying the entire spectrum of experiments flight tests: Loads, Flutter, Flying Qualities Expansion, Stall Tests, Airdrop and Air Refueling.

(e) 1997 Promoted to Chief Pilot C-17.

(2) Director of Flight Operations for all Boeing Airlift and Tankers Programs, 1998-2008.

(a) Responsible for all aircrew and support person-nel for the following programs: C-17, KC-10, KC-135, an C-130 avionics upgrade programs (locations: Seattle, Long Beach, Edwards AFB, Wichita and San Antonio)

(b) Provided world-wide ferry/Depot input for USAF after 911 to relieve Air Force Aircrew to concentrate on the War on Terror. This included providing aircrew for "in-theater" damaged aircraft recovery.

(c) Personally led an augmented crew to ferry a C-17 that landed at night 1600 feet short of the runway in a Soviet mine field at Kandahar. Flew 7800 miles nonstop, air refueling twice, to land at San Antonio, Texas. The aircraft had one landing left and had to touch down at no more than .5 feet per second.
