Summary of Significant Career Events

- (1) Was in the first group of nuggets to go straight from the training command to the F14 RAG.
- (2) Fortunate to have two different tours as an instructor at Navy Fighter Weapons School. Second tour was as officer in charge of a small detachment at Nellis AFB that, with a small group of USAF officers, flew Mig 21 and Mig 23/27 aircraft in what was then a higly classified program. Program provided adversary training to USAF/USN/USMC pilots. Flew 166 Mig 21 and 191 Mig 23/27 sorties.
- (3) Tailhook Association West Coast Fighter pilot of the year for 1983.
- (4) Tailhook Association Tailhooker of the Year for 1999.
- (5) Over 3000 hours in the F-14A.
- (6) As VF84 XO/CO, back to back Battle E and Safety S awards were earned.
- (7) In CARGRUTHREE tour, to support 2003 surge for Iraq operations, completed a normal battlegroup one year training cycle in less than ninety days, deployed and filled the Pacific battlegroup requirement for the next nine months.
- (8) Lifetime member of ANA and Tailhook Association since the early 80's. Served as Chairman of the Board for Tailhook Association for five years (2011-2016).
