- (4) As CINCUSNAVEUR and CINCSOUTH, led Operation Allied Force and JTF Noble Anvil in combat operations, humanitarian assistance, and occupation forces during the 1999 Kosovo conflict.
- (5) Provided on-site expertise and coordinated the US commercial nuclear industry support to Japan following the 2011 Fukushima nuclear accident.
