**Summary of Significant Career Events** 

(1) Flew in the 'Line of Death' operations off of Libya aboard Coral Sea, making numerous intercepts of Libyan Fitters, Floggers and Foxbats.

(2) Launching from USS *Saratoga* in the Red Sea, scored the first Navy MiG kill of Operation Desert Storm on 17 January 1991 prior to delivering bombs on target. Was a poster child for the Strike Fighter concept for a while after that....

(3) After Desert Storm, couldn't get back from my new joint assignment at Supreme Headquarters, Allied Powers Europe (SHAPE) to attend Tailhook '91 -- turned out missing that particular Tailhook wasn't a bad thing after all....

(4) After O-5 command of VFA-81, worked in the Navy's Office of Legislative Affairs (OLA) on the Navy's highest priority programs -- the FA-18E/F Super Hornet and USS *George H.W. Bush* (CVN-77) -- little dreaming I'd have the honor and pleasure of being 5th Fleet Commander 13 years later when CVN-77, loaded with Super Hornets, make her first operational deployment.

(5) Launched off of USS *Constellation* and served as overall Mission Commander and Strike Lead for the opening strike of Operation Iraqi Freedom on 21 March 2003. Really satisfying to put together a joint and coalition opening strike of over 100 aircraft.

(6) Completed my career in Naval Aviation with nearly 5000 mishap-free flight hours in 21 different types of military aircraft, logging over 3300 hours in the F/A-18 A-F Hornet/ Super Hornet and 1200 hours in the A-7E Corsair II. During my 38 year career, I flew over 100 combat sorties and logged 1349 arrested landings on 15 different aircraft carriers.
