Summary of Significant Career Events

(1) Carrier arrested landings on 10 carriers .

(2) April 1965 - Mid Air- First Tonkin Gulf fly-off to Cubi Point from USS *Midway*, number 11 in a 12 plane rendezvous, number 12 collided underneath with vertical stabilizer into my main fuel tank (A-4C), number 12 ejected and recovered, Lt Bill Newman A-4 tanker configured broke formation and streamed drogue, I plugged in indicating 200 lbs fuel that did not increase, unplugged on final, trapped, burst into flames, flamed out, saved combat asset. (DFC)

(3) June 1965 - Shot Down- Volunteered for previously flown HO Chi Minh trail recce mission, over North Vietnam into Norther Laos near China border, previous mission with no enemy contact. Shot down with AAA over 300 miles from the carrier in A-4C. Evaded for two days while Navy, Air Force and Air America assets successfully rescued me after destroying the enemy bivouac, anti-air enplacement, truck park areas that I had discovered on the ground. (Bronze Star)

(4) Battle E (VA 176, *Nimitz*)- As Commanding Officer of VA-176 and USS *Nimitz* was able to guide each to COMNAVAIRLANT Battle E Awards prior to the end of command tours.

(5) SACLANT short tour (4 mo)- 1st Flag job, not having had a Washington tour, was determined I needed to check the Pentagon "block" for career "enhancement".

(6) Fly combat as Flag LT- Accepted Flag Lt job in order to go to Test Pilot School instead of PG School, as such was able to fly combat from three different carriers during one staff deployment. (1966).

(7) Flight test- A7D/E Joint NPE with max weight take offs from Dallas Fort Worth airport, BIS A7A, flying the F-6 (F4D) and the only 2 seated F8 in operation, A7 flame out/ restart, T28 spin tests, A-7 anti-skid brake tests at Pax.

(8) USS *Midway* elevator lost into Indian Ocean during deployment (1963).

(9) USS Wabash- assume/relinquish Command in Indian Ocean.

(10) Birth of Zumwalt Class (stealth) while OP 982 (1985).

(11) As COMCARGRUSIX hosted President and Mrs. Reagan at Mayport after the attack on USS *Stark* by two Iraqi Exocet missiles.

(12) As DEPCINCUSNAVEUR- taking the first ships into the Soviet Union (from Mediterranean to Sevastopol) after the "wall" came down.

(13) As DEPCINCUSNAVEUR- called to Whitehall for First Sea Load to explain a steam generator leak in a British nuclear submarine (he was not a NUC).

(14) Post CO *Nimitz* tour, as new one star assigned to assess the feasibility of defensive carrier operations in the Norwegian fjords by on sight visits.

(15) Extremely fortunate throughout my career to be in the right place at the right time and to be surrounded by extremely capable superiors, contemporaries, and subordinates.
