Comments on Commands:

1. While serving as CO of HS-12, the squadron twice deployed aboard USS Midway to the Indian Ocean, won three COMASWWINGPAC Top Torpedo awards, the Battle "E"; the Isbell and Thach awards (best ASW squadron in Pacific and Navy)

2. While serving as CO of USS *Inchon* (LPD-12), the ship was diverted from a routine Med Cruise to Mogadishu, Somalia, to provide security forces ashore to support the evacuation of Air Force and Army personnel after "Black Hawk Down". One week after returning from a six month deployment, the ship and Marine forces were alert deployed to Haiti for a potential amphibious landing.



3. Serving as Commodore of a four ship squadron, the flag ship (USS *Guam*) was diverted from the Med to conduct a non-combatatant evacuation of the American Embassy in Monrovia, Liberia. Stayed in support of the American Ambassador for almost 60 days.

4. While serving as CO of HS-10 (FRS), elected to be national President of the Naval Helicopter Association (NHA) for one year.

5. Other Tours: HC-7, NAS Bermuda, HS-6, Naval War College, HS-10, OPNAV (OP-01B EA), Industrial College of the Armed Forces, BUPERS (Aviation Commander Detailer), USACOM – J61, CINCLANTFLT – Head of Fleet Training (N-7).

Combat/Flight PerformanceAwards:

Navy Cross - awarded for night over-land combat rescue of an A-7 pilot north of Vinh, North Vietnam on 7 August 1972.

Single Action Air Medal - awarded for a day rescue of an RA-5 pilot a few miles outside of Haiphong Harbor under fire of coastal guns. During this same time period, helicopter crew was additionally assigned to a secret mission to monitor a geographic area near the coastline of North Vietnam searching for American POW's that had possibly escaped from North Vietnam prisons.

Air Medal

Navy Commendation Medal - awarded for a 50 nm range medevac from a cruise ship off the coast of Bermuda at maximum range of the UH-1N.
