- (3) After completing T-2 and A-4 training in Meridian, MS I received IP orders as a SERGRAD in VT-7. Rented a house on the GC, bought a boat, and enjoyed as many NAVY TRAINING X-CTRY flights as humanly possible. The veteran IPs taught us a lot, and prepared us better for the Fleet... BZ and many thanks MAC, HOOTER, BEEF, WOODY, ICE, BICK & BUBBA. And to our senior JOs Brett Pops Batchelder, Craig Animal Williams, George Mason, who led the way.
- (4) Thrilled to get FA-18 orders to Lemoore Steve Warden Davis, Dan Redbone Martin, Jim Red Dog Collins, Bob Woody Wood, Ernie Shine Wattam got us knucklehead nuggets through the VFA 125 RAG. Forever grateful!
- (5) Stood on the shoulders of absolute giants Skipper Dan Gabby Gabriel and XO/CO Greg Shifty Peairs, VFA 25 Fist of the Fleet JO Tour. More giants, Senior JOs Dan Dix Dixon, Carrol Lex Lefon, Chuck Sterno Sternberg kept us newbies in line. After painting the NAS CUBI front gate A-4 in fine Fisty colors & logos (CO NAS Cubi NOT happy), we set off for what became operations in support of Operation Desert Shield. Broke the fuel probe off my trusty Hornet refueling on the IRON MAIDEN during our initial CAP sorties, earned a new callsign for a few weeks for that buffoonery. CAG Spook Yakely kept us fired up. Throughout that JO tour, we took delivery of two sets of brand-new FA-18Cs, Lot 11s in late 89, and Lot 14s in '91, thank you McDonnell Douglas / Boeing.
